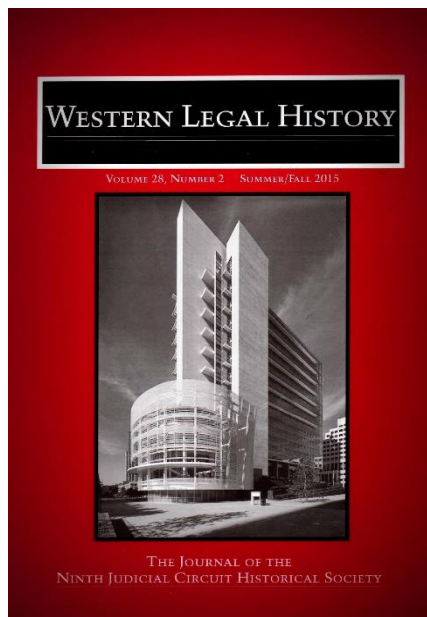

On February 24, 2017, the NJCHS premiered its newest traveling exhibit exploring **Executive Order 9066, which created the Japanese Incarceration, on its 75th anniversary.** The eight-paneled exhibit looks at anti-Japanese American sentiment prior to the start of WWII; the impact of the required “evacuation” and incarceration of Japanese Americans during WWII; the varied reactions to the incarceration within the Japanese American community; the *coram nobis* cases of *Korematsu*, *Hirabayashi* and *Yasui* in the Ninth Circuit; and finally the aftermath of the incarceration including formal apologies by Presidents Reagan and George H. W. Bush.
